Registering Club (1)

You must belong to one or more of the Felis Britannica member clubs in order to use Felis Britannica's registration services and have nominated a club through which to process your registrations. All registration applications must be sent to that nominated club. Enter the membership number you hold with the club you have nominated to process your registrations.

Name of Cat (2)

The name of the cat must not exceed 35 characters including spaces

Sex (3)

Adult pet cats (i.e. over 10 months old) may not be shown unless they have been neutered. For Adult cats, use FN (Female neuter) or MN (Male Neuter) for kittens you can use F (Female) or M (Male)

Coat colour and pattern (4)

Please indicate the colour and pattern (e.g tabby). Examples: Black and white, tabby, red (also known as ginger), red tabby and white, white, blue (also known as grey, tortoiseshell, etc.

Coat Length (5)

Please state Longhair or Shorthair

Date of birth (6)

Please state date of birth if known. If not known exactly, please give nearest estimate e.g 20/4/00 or April 2000 or 2000

Certificate of Hearing (7)

A certificate of hearing is required for all solid white cats and kittens before they can be shown. This does not apply to cats which have some colour with the white e.g. a white and black cat does not need a certificate of hearing.
